BWS Announces New Head of School:

Michael Molina

Dear Bishop Walker School Community,

It is my great pleasure to announce that the Governing Board of the Bishop John T. Walker School for Boys has enthusiastically selected **Mr. Michael Molina** as Head of School, effective July 1, 2020.

Mike succeeds our Executive Director and President, James Woody, who will retire June 30, 2020, after skillfully leading the BWS community since our school's inception. James and his team have been working closely with Mike to ensure a seamless transition of leadership this summer.

During the search process, Mike impressed us with his vision for promoting a strong academic program at BWS; developing each boy's academic, emotional, and spiritual strengths; and supporting continued excellence in teaching and learning. Currently, Mike is the founding director of the Finney-Greene Program, which supports boys from underrepresented communities at Gilman School—a pre-K through 12th grade independent day school for boys in Baltimore. He is a sought-after consultant for independent schools throughout Maryland, crafting culturally responsive K-12 curriculae. Mike

offers a broad spectrum of experience in independent school leadership, with over a decade of experience as an educator, curriculum developer, and innovator in youth development nonprofits.

Mike holds a J.D. from Yale Law School and a B.A. in English from Xavier University of Louisiana. Through his wide-ranging professional experiences, he recognizes the potential in every child, adult, and community he works with. He has advocated for investment in youth development in California; designed a program for displaced youth from his native New Orleans following Hurricane Katrina; launched a groundbreaking charter school; and

directed educational programs for refugees. He shares that he is "deeply moved by the shared purpose, community, and optimism of teachers, students, parents, and board

members of BWS," and he looks forward to building upon our "strong foundation, so that students and faculty can continue to demonstrate excellence that will attract and sustain the support of those who care deeply about the school's mission."



Please welcome Mike, his wife Jessy, and two children, Maya and Miles, to the Bishop Walker School and to Washington, DC. We are delighted that they are joining the BWS family.

Ms. Lynne Hines-Bogle's Garden-Art classes are off to a strong start this year! First trimester began with the boys spreading mulch from THEARC Farm's compost heap into the dedicated BWS planting beds. With Ms. Bogle's help, our 3rd-5th grade scholars planted a variety of vegetables and herbs, including garlic, onions, kale, collards, Swiss chard, and more. After watching their plants grow in the garden throughout the end of summer and into fall, Ms. Bogle brought the 5th grade inside for a cooking lesson of "Must-Go," a dish made from ingredients found in the refrigerator and pantry that "must go" into some kind of dish before they spoil. This dish

included some of the vegetables that the boys grew outside in the garden. As fall turns into winter, Ms. Bogle will focus more on the art aspect of Garden-Art classes with an

introduction to weaving.
